What a great opening weekend for Hayaa Football! Thank you to all our Eagle Duty Volunteers for a smooth Opening Day! **Just a reminder:** CHILDREN are not allowed in the concession stand during your Eagle Duty Shift. If this poses a problem for you, please contact **your** Team Coordinator and they would be happy to move you to either the Gate or the Merchandise table where children can accompany you.

Gate Fee's, etc...

Admission to Hartland Home games: **\$4** per person, **\$3** for persons over 60,
\$3 for students & **Free** for 5 and under.

If you are doing your Eagle Duty- volunteer hours- at the stadium the day of your game....you are still required to pay admission. Our gate fees are a major contributor to our revenue that helps keep our kids in safe equipment and our facility something to be proud of.

The ONLY exceptions are:

1. **Hayaa Board** members who are wearing a Lanyard.....if they aren't wearing it....they pay.
2. **Color & Team Coordinators**
3. **HHS Students** coming to work for volunteer hours required for school.
4. **Hartland Football Coaches, Hartland Cheer Coaches, Hartland football players, Hartland Cheerleaders, Opposing football players and cheerleaders**
5. All members of the LCAJFL get in FREE.....there is a cheat sheet of these people in the gate box.

Opposing coaches for both cheer and football MUST PAY. This is a LCAJFL rule....NOT a Hartland rule. If a coach from the opposing team gives you a hard time, call the Color Commissioner in charge immediately to deal with it.

If there are any questions, they can be directed to any Hayaa Football Board member. Problems at the Gate with admission will be handled by a Color Commissioner/Coordinator or another Board Member.

Press & Argus Hartland Footballs Best—Players of the Decade:

The Livingston Daily Press & Argus has compiled a list of Hartlands Best football players of the decade. We've done a little research ourselves and discovered Hayaa has been a part of it. Please celebrate the achievements of these Hartland residents (or former residents) and thanks for being a part of the Hayaa Organization!

****at press time we were unable to confirm some of the players played Hayaa sports, we will update this info on our website as it becomes available.*

Chris Cagle-Former Hayaa Football Player—Parents: *Mr. & Mrs. Cagle were instrumental in the beginning of the Hayaa Football Program*

- Worked Hartland's spread offense to near-perfection during 2008 season, which saw the Eagles win nine games (9-2) for the first time in school history. He accounted for 29 touchdowns, 16 passing, 13 rushing, while throwing only three interceptions in 194 passes. He accomplished all this despite being the primary focus of opposing defenses. He also was a basketball standout for the Eagles. Now playing at Ferris State.
- Coach Marcus Dukes says: "Chris was a great talent and a great leader for us. He showed great poise and made a lot of big plays in his two years running the offense for us."

Jeff Ashley

- Lineman was a constant for Eagles during coaching transition in mid-decade. ... Went on to play at Adrian College.
- Coach Cory Gildersleeve says: "Jeff was very consistent on the field and in the weight room. He was a very good leader on and off the field."

Jim Bunn

- Lineman had rare combination of size and quickness at tackle. ... First of three brothers to play for Eagles. ... Also a stalwart at heavyweight on Hartland * wrestling team.
- Coach Todd Cobb says: "Jim was the most athletic big man I ever coached. He had great feet and was able to engage in a block, keep his feet moving and give people a ride downfield."

Jeremy Jess

- Two-way starter for Hartland. ...
- Cobb: "Jeremy was always around the ball on defense. He was relentless. He wasn't extremely gifted athletically, but he had a good sense of putting us in the right play at the right time. He had traits you just can't coach."

Brian Hanner

- All-County running back excelled on defense for the Eagles. ... Also played a key role on defense for Hartland in the middle of the decade and had 90 tackles his senior season. Went on to play at Northwood.
- Gildersleeve says: "Brian was a dominant physical force for us. He was a great year-round leader."

Sean Hoorelbeke—Former Hayaa Football & Baseball Player---we think

- Three-year starter linebacker for Hartland also saw action at several skill positions on offense. Went to Central Michigan on baseball scholarship and was drafted by the Chicago Cubs.
- Cobb: "Sean was the best all-around athlete we had in the four years I was there. He was very coachable and was our quarterback on defense. He always had us lined up right and in the right checks. He was invaluable."

Vonn Jones

- Key on offense and defense for 2008 team, with nearly 1,000 all-purpose yards each of his two seasons. Now playing basketball for a Texas junior college.

- Dukes: "Maybe the best athlete we've had at Hartland since I've been there. He was a great kick returner, an outstanding wide receiver and a good defensive back. He was a phenomenal athlete."

Greg Matthyssen—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- Two-year starter was a do-everything player for the Eagles, seeing time at running back and receiver while returning kicks and serving as Hartland's kicker. He later played at Defiance College.
- Dukes: Greg was very athletic and had some real skills. He made big plays in big games and handled a multitude of responsibilities."

Zack Minor—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- Played soccer full-time and was Hartland's kicker, too. ... Kicked three field goals in a game hours after playing in a soccer district final ... Playing soccer at Saginaw Valley.
- Dukes: "Zack was a two-year starter as our kicker, and I think he missed 2 of 90 PAT tries. He was Mr. Automatic when it came to scoring points."

Drew Mixter—*Former Hayaa Football & Baseball Player Parents: Mr & Mrs. Mixter were instrumental in the Hayaa Baseball Program*

- Three-year player led team in rushing for three seasons, despite playing only five games as a sophomore. Two-sport standout (baseball, football) is doing the same at Oberlin College.
- Dukes: "Drew had all the intangibles. He was a great blocker in the passing game and could lineup at wide receiver. He really had a good feel for the game."

John Mueller

- Two-year standout whose career was ended by injury during his senior season.
- Cobb: "John was an outstanding lineman who had very good closing speed as a tackler. He was very coachable and a nice kid off the field, and not very nice on the field, and I mean that in a good way."

Dan Stevens—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- His brother, Jon, also was a Hartland standout. ... Moved from linebacker to tackle as a senior when Mueller was injured. ... Two-way standout also a two-time All-County selection.
- Cobb: "Dan was a great lineman for us and one of the most versatile linemen we had. He played guard and tackle on offense and was a very coachable, hard-working kid."

Jon Stevens—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- Played tight end and defensive end for the Eagles. ... A key player on 2008 team. ... Also a basketball standout at Hartland
- Dukes: "Jon allowed us to do a lot of things because he was big and physical in the passing game, where we were able to create some mismatches. On defense, he was a force to be reckoned with on the edge. He also was a dominant blocker."

Chad Takacs—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- Three-year starter on offense at linebacker also was key to Eagles rushing attack his final two seasons. ... Combined with Hoorelbeke to anchor Hartland defense.
- Cobb: "Chad was a great football player for us. He had a tremendous nose for the football on defense. On offense he was a fullback and he ran the trap very well. He was patient enough to let the play develop and once he saw daylight, he was explosive through the hole."

Josh Theis—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- Played right tackle on offense and was a tackle on defense for Eagles during 2008 regional run ... Point man for line in the team's rushing attack.
- Dukes: Josh was a dominant offensive and defensive tackle. He really spearheaded things our run game and did things on offense that helped us score a lot of point.

Jake Warner—*Former Hayaa Football Player*

- Two-way starter for the Eagles on offensive and defensive line. ... Part of a stalwart defense in 2008. ... Now playing at Grand Rapids Community College.
 - Dukes: "Jake might be the toughest kid I've had since I've been here. He was good on offense, but he really excelled on defense. If there's a street fight, you wanted him on your side."
